ABOUT THE 2024 SHOW

The Maleny Wood Expo has everything timber, from native tree seedlings, mobile milling and slabs to furniture and sculpture, hand-crafted products by furniture-makers, toy-makers, musical instrument-makers and box-makers, whittlers and carvers, and demonstrations by chainsaw, woodworking tool and equipment experts. The Wood Expo also hosts a range of environmental education organisations who support the general public to learn more about the important ways the community can get involved in conservation and regeneration efforts.

Located in the Sunshine Coast's beautiful Hinterland at the iconic Maleny Showgrounds, the Maleny Wood Expo also showcases sustainable alternatives for the home, natural resource management displays, First Nations perspectives and workshops, and much more.

For younger visitors there is the Junior Landcare Paddock, packed with workshops and activities, where children can use real tools to make toys, family gifts and other useful items. Teen and adult workshops allow for a range of intergenerational learning opportunities, and with historical woodcrafting practices kept alive and passed on, youth are supported to develop skills for life as part of these offerings.

There's entertainment for all with live local music, healthy, nourishing food and a family-friendly, laid-back atmosphere. A speakers program also encourages thought-provoking and meaningful discussions about environmental conservation, land management and timber production and sustainable sourcing and harvesting.

Expanding on the successes of a reinvigorated Maleny Wood Expo in 2023, the 2024 Wood Expo will include an expanded youth program of workshops and educational experiences for a younger generation, as well as an integrated Sustainability Expo in partnership with local businesses.

2024 is set to be a successful year, in celebrating 25 years* of the Maleny Wood Expo.

ABOUT THE SUNSHINE COAST WOOTHA PRIZE

'Wootha' is a local Kabi Kabi / Gubbi Gubbi name for Red Cedar, a beautiful tree that grew in the subtropical rainforests which once dominated Maleny, the Blackall Ranges and much of the East Coast of Australia. Early European settlers and timber getters who prized the Red Cedar above other species and cleared land for agriculture, were unfortunately responsible for significantly diminishing the distribution of this species. But small remaining remnants of rainforest along with the work of caring community members and Landcare groups such as Barung Landcare, has seen this beautiful timber tree and rainforest species make a comeback to the region and other areas of Eastern Australia. Today, Red Cedar is grown and harvested in much slower and more sustainable ways.

The Sunshine Coast Wootha Prize is a prestigious national woodworking competition that forms the feature exhibition at the Maleny Wood Expo.

The competition showcases beautiful and sustainably crafted pieces from wood artisans and furniture makers from all over Australia. This year's competition is open themed, meaning there are no limitations to how applicants may express themselves through their work under any of the categories of Furniture, Sculpture and Tiny Treasures.

Entrants are in the running to win:

- Overall first prize of \$10,000, Sponsored by Sunshine Coast Council
- Sculpture \$2,500
- Furniture \$2,500
- Tiny Treasures \$2,500
- People's Choice \$500
